Chief Warrant Officer Four (CW4) Higdon was born and raised in Owensboro, Kentucky and in 1988, he enlisted in the U.S. Army. Later that year, he completed Basic Training at Fort Knox, Kentucky and Advanced Individual Training at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indiana. His initial assignment after graduation from the Legal Specialist Course at Fort Benjamin Harrison, was with the 2nd Battalion, 67th Armor, 3d Armored Division in Friedberg, Germany.

His other enlisted assignments include: Legal Specialist, U.S. Army Medical Activity, Fort Stewart, Georgia; Pretrial NCO, 24th Infantry Division, Fort Stewart, Georgia; NCOIC, OSJA, Military Traffic Management Command (Eastern Area), Bayonne, New Jersey; and Automation NCO, 3d Infantry Division, Fort Stewart, Georgia.

On 1 September 2011, he began serving as the Chief Warrant Officer of the Judge Advocate General's Corps.

CW4 Higdon is a graduate of the Warrant Officer Senior Staff Course, Warrant Officer Staff Course, Warrant Officer Advanced Course, Warrant Officer Basic Course; Legal Administrator Course; Planning, Programming, Budgeting and Execution System Course; and the Pre-Command Recruiting Course. CW4 Higdon's awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (with three Oak Leaf Clusters), Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal (with five Oak Leaf Clusters), and the Army Achievement Medal. He is also entitled to wear the Recruiting Badge.
