COME NOW the undersigned appellate defense counsel, pursuant to Rules 23
and 24 of this Court's Rules of Appellate Procedure, and move for a 30-day
extension of time until 15 November 2021 to file a Brief on Behalf of Appellant.

1. Consistent with Army Regulation 27-26, Rules of Professional
Conduct for Lawyers, the undersigned counsel request additional time
to ensure that counsel has diligently investigated, thoroughly
researched, and appropriately briefed the assignments of error in this
case in order to fulfill counsels' ethical obligation to represent the
appellant's interest.

2. This was a contested case. The transcript contains 1,273 pages and
an additional 1,509 pages of exhibits and allied documents (plus
multiple discs). The sentence was adjudged on 16 December 2020,
and it included a dishonorable discharge and confinement for life with
the eligibility for parole. Appellant is currently confined. Appellant
has been consulted and consents to this request.

3. The Brief on Behalf of Appellant is currently due on 16 October 2021. Appellant requests a 30-day extension of time to 15 November 2021 to file appellant's brief.

4. First undersigned counsel currently has eleven cases pending a brief before this court (including four contested cases) and two before the Court of Appeals for the Armed Forces. First undersigned counsel also has eleven cases submitted to this court pending Government response or decision and five before the Court of Appeals for the Armed Forces. In the next two months, first undersigned counsel also has one oral argument before this court and one before the Court of Appeals for the Armed Forces.

5. Undersigned counsel request additional time to review the record, research issues, investigate matters, confer with appellant, and accomplish supervisory review.

WHEREFORE, appellate defense counsel respectfully request that this court grant the instant motion.


