Shuck and Colonel Jeffrey W. Hart, military judges, presiding.

UNITED STATES ARMY COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS

COME NOW the undersigned appellate defense counsel, pursuant to Rules 23 and 24 of this Court's Rules of Appellate Procedure, and move for a 30-day extension of time until 2 December 2022 to file a Brief on Behalf of Appellant.

1. Consistent with Army Regulation 27-26, Rules of Professional Conduct for Lawyers, the undersigned counsel request additional time to ensure that counsel has diligently investigated, thoroughly researched, and appropriately briefed the assignments of error in this case in order to fulfill counsels' ethical obligation to represent the appellant's interest.

2. This is a contested case. The trial transcript contains 524 pages and the record of trial consists of 1,006 pages. The sentence was adjudged on 29 June 2021, and it included a dishonorable discharge, confinement for 48 months, forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and reduction to Private E1. Appellant is currently in confinement. Appellant concurs with this request.

3. The Brief on Behalf of Appellant is due on 2 November 2022. Appellant requests a 30-day extension of time to 2 December 2022 to file appellant's brief.

4. First undersigned counsel currently has six cases before this Court pending opening briefs (including three contested cases), with approximately 2,427 transcript pages, as well as a reply brief due before this court on 2 November 2022 (*United States v. Cerrud*, ARMY 20210185). Additionally, first undersigned counsel has four cases before the Court of Appeals for the Armed Forces (CAAF) pending supplements.

5. First undersigned counsel is assigned to *United States v. Hasan*, No. 21-0193/AR. The appellee's brief was submitted on 20 October 2022. The appellant's reply brief is currently due on 8 November 2022.

6. Undersigned counsel requests additional time to review the record, research issues, confer with appellant, and accomplish supervisory review.

WHEREFORE, appellate defense counsel respectfully request that this Court grant the instant motion.
