Procedure, the undersigned appellate government counsel files this opposition to appellant’s Motion to Attach Appellate Exhibits A–C, dated 23 February 2024.


Courts of criminal appeals may not consider anything outside of the “entire record” when reviewing a sentence under Article 66(c), Uniform Code of Military Justice. *United States v. Willman*, 81 M.J. 355, 358 (C.A.A.F. 2021) (citing *United States v. Fagnan*, 12 U.S.C.M.A. 192, 30 C.M.R. 192 (1961)); *United States v. Jessie*, 79 M.J. 437 (C.A.A.F. 2021) (declining to consider material outside the record beyond the context of Article 55, UCMJ, and the Eighth Amendment).

WHEREFORE, the United States prays this honorable court deny appellant's

motion.
