COME NOW the undersigned appellate defense counsel, pursuant to Rules 23 and 24 of this court's Rules of Appellate Procedure, and move for a thirty-day extension of time until 19 March 2023 to file a Brief on Behalf of Appellant.

1. This is a contested case involving two specifications of an Article 120 offense. The transcript and associated exhibits are approximately 600 pages. The sentence adjudged on 24 May 2022 included confinement for 120 days and a dishonorable discharge. Appellant is no longer in confinement.

2. In addition to the above-captioned case, the first undersigned counsel is detailed to nine other active cases, including *United States v. Hasan*, a death penalty case. Moreover, the first undersigned counsel is acting in a supervisory capacity on cases before the Court of Appeals for the Armed Forces with pleadings that are anticipated to be filed this month.
