**WHEREAS:**

On 27 February 2025, petitioner filed a Petition for Extraordinary Relief with this court requesting review of his court-martial for jurisdictional defects and issuance of a writ of error *coram nobis* under the All Writs Act, 28 U.S.C. § 1651(a) providing, among other things, the vacating of appellant's findings and sentence, the reinstatement of appellant's rank, and the dismissal of charges with prejudice. On 10 March 2025, petitioner filed a supplemental brief in support of his first Petition for Extraordinary Relief. On 13 March 2025, petitioner filed a second Petition for Extraordinary Relief requesting review of his court-martial for ineffective assistance of counsel and issuance of a writ of error *coram nobis* under the All Writs Act, 28 U.S.C. § 1651(a). On 17 March 2025, petitioner filed a third Petition for Extraordinary Relief requesting consideration of newly discovered evidence regarding the absence of a valid confinement order and related pay discrepancies, which petitioner contends create additional jurisdictional errors, and issuance of a writ of error *coram nobis* under the All Writs Act, 28 U.S.C. § 1651(a).

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:**

On consideration of the three Petitions for Extraordinary Relief in the Nature of a Writ of *Coram Nobis* in the above-entitled cause, the petitions are DENIED.
