**TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF THE
UNITED STATES ARMY COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS**

COMES NOW the undersigned appellate defense counsel, pursuant to Rule 23 of this Court’s Rules of Appellate Procedure, and moves this honorable court to compel the government to produce a working copy of Prosecution Exhibit 26. The record of trial (ROT) contains a disc purporting to be Prosecution Exhibit 26, but that disc is defective.

In accordance with Rule for Courts-Martial (RCM) 1112(b)(6), admitted exhibits shall be included as part of the record of trial. Without this disc, which contains the accused’s statements to law enforcement, appellate defense counsel cannot perform a full review of the case, and this Court cannot perform its full

review pursuant to Article 66, Uniform Code of Military Justice. The accused's statements were relevant to all the offenses for which he was found guilty and are critical to evaluating multiple assignments of error under consideration by appellate defense counsel. Therefore, the undersigned appellate defense counsel respectfully request that the government be compelled to produce a working copy of Prosecution Exhibit 26.
