Publication exchange subscriptions are available to law schools and other organizations that publish legal periodicals. For Army legal offices, including within the Army National Guard and the U.S. Army Reserve, and other federal agencies, inquiries and

SUBMISSION OF WORKS: The *Military Law Review* accepts submissions of works from military and civilian authors. The *Military Law Review*'s Editorial Board evaluates any work that is submitted for publication. In determining whether to publish a work, the Editorial

Board considers the work's substantive accuracy, comprehensiveness, organization, clarity, timeliness, originality, and value to the military legal community. No minimum or maximum length requirement exists. The Editorial Board's decisions are subject to final approval by the Dean, The Judge Advocate General's School, U.S. Army.

All submissions must be in Microsoft Word format and should be sent to the Editor, *Military Law Review*, at usarmy.pentagon.hqda-tjaglcs.list.tjaglcs-mlr-editor2@mail.mil or the Technical Editor, *Military Law Review*, at usarmy.pentagon.hqda-tjaglcs.list.tjaglcs-tech-editor@mail.mil. If electronic mail is not available, please forward the submission in duplicate, double-spaced, to the Technical Editor, *Military Law Review*, The Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School, U.S. Army, 600 Massie Road, Charlottesville, Virginia 22903-1781.

Footnotes should be typed double-spaced and numbered consecutively from the beginning to the end of the writing, not chapter by chapter. Citations should conform to *The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation* (19th ed. 2010), copyrighted by the *Columbia, Harvard, and University of Pennsylvania Law Reviews* and the *Yale Law Journal*, and to the *Military Citation Guide* (TJAGLCS 19th ed. 2014).

Typescripts should include biographical data concerning the author or authors. This information should consist of branch of service, duty title, present and prior positions or duty assignments, all degrees (with names of granting schools and years received), and previous publications. If submitting a lecture or a paper prepared in partial fulfillment of degree requirements, the author should include the date and place of delivery of the lecture or the date and source of the degree.

The *Military Law Review* may make necessary revisions or deletions without prior permission of the author. An author is responsible for the accuracy of the author's work, including citations and footnotes.

COPYRIGHT: Unless expressly noted in an article, all articles are works of the United States Government in which no copyright subsists. Where copyright is indicated in an article, all further rights are reserved to the article's author.
