Major General Bobby Christine assumed duties as The Judge Advocate General of the Army on 1 July 2025. He is a graduate of Samford University, Cumberland School of Law, the University of Georgia, and Georgia Military College. He holds a Master's in Strategic Studies from the US Army War College, and is a National Security Fellow of the Maxwell School at Syracuse University, as well as a graduate of Harvard University's Homeland Security Executive Seminar.

MG Christine's previous military assignments include Acting General Counsel of the National Guard Bureau (NGB). In that role, he served as the principal legal advisor to the Chief, NGB; Vice Chief, NGB; and the Directors of the Army and Air National Guard on issues relative to the 436,000+ National Guard members. Immediately preceding his duties as Acting General Counsel, MG Christine served as the Special Assistant to the Director of the Army National Guard for the Department of the Army, Office of The Judge Advocate General where he advised on and coordinated TJAG initiatives relative to the Army National Guard Title 32 Judge Advocate community. MG Christine's previous Judge Advocate assignments include service as SJA - Georgia National Guard, and a litany of early positions including duty as Trial Counsel – 265th Engineer Group (Iraq). Prior to becoming a Judge Advocate, MG Christine served as a Combat Engineer officer for nearly a decade.

Prior to his appointment as The Judge Advocate General, MG Christine was the elected District Attorney of Georgia's Columbia Judicial Circuit, and previously served as United States Attorney for the Southern District of Georgia, Acting United States Attorney for the Northern District of Georgia, and Magistrate Judge of Columbia County, Georgia. For nearly 15 years, he maintained a private practice of law.
