Brigadier General John W. Miller II, was born in Frankfurt, West Germany. He graduated from Auburn University in 1983, receiving a commission through R.O.T.C. as a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Army. He deferred entry to active duty and entered Cumberland School of Law, graduating in 1986.
