Lieutenant Colonel Shaun Lister is the Kenneth J. Hodson Chair, Criminal Law Department at The Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School. Lieutenant Colonel Lister graduated with High Honors from the University of Maine in 1989 and obtained his law degree from the University of Maine School of Law in 1993.

Lieutenant Colonel Lister is licensed to practice law in the State of Maine and was admitted to the Maine Bar in 1993. He practiced in state and federal courts throughout the State of Maine, practicing primarily in the areas of civil insurance and corporate defense litigation until he joined the Army Judge Advocate General's Corps in 2005.
