


RAF Repository User's Guide

Welcome to the RAF Repository! The RAF Repository should be your first stop in researching for your RAF mission. This guide is designed to help you navigate the website and find relevant research materials. Be sure to check the ASCC points of contact and reach out to the ASCC for help in preparing for your RAF mission.

1. Login to JAGCNet and select Legal Disciplines.



2. Under Legal Disciplines, look under International and Ops Law. You will find a link for the RAF Repository. Select that link.

3. You will arrive at the RAF Homepage which shows a map of the world broken down by the various Geographic Combatant Command (GCC) areas of responsibility. The links around the globe will provide useful research tools outside of the RAF Repository. Select the GCC for your RAF country. In this example, we will select USPACOM because we are preparing for a mission in Malaysia.




4. Once you select the GCC, you will receive a list of countries within the GCC. In addition, you will find folders for Theater wide documents, Multinational Exercise documents, and a POC list for the ASCC.




5. After you select the country of Malaysia, you will be given a choice of twelve different types of documents that appear for every country in the Repository. Counters, listed in parenthesis, let you know how many documents are in each of the twelve categories.




6. Select the International Agreements folder.



7. When you select the International Agreements folder, you will find the ACSA and any SOFA or diplomatic notes that the U.S. has signed with Malaysia. The default view is called the Simple View. You can also change it to view a more detailed view of the list of documents which includes notes from the ASCC.



8. From the list of documents page (either the Simple View or the Detailed View), you merely need to click on the name of the file to open the full document. When you are finished looking at this list of documents, you have several options for continuing your research. You may 1) clear some or all of the search filters, 2) switch GCCs or countries or document type in the left-hand side pane, 3) go back to the RAF Home page using the link, or 4) simply go back to the previous page using your browser back button.
