Brigadier General (BG) Steven Ranieri has contributed 28 years of dedicated service to our Army and our Nation. He has excelled as a lawyer and a leader in challenging and diverse assignments in the Judge Advocate General's Corps. BG Ranieri has served with distinction as a Staff Judge Advocate for the 3rd Infantry Division, Fort Stewart, Georgia, and a Deputy Staff Judge Advocate for the 25th Infantry Division, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. He has served as the Chief, Plans Branch, Personnel, Plans, and Training Office, Office of The Judge Advocate General (OTJAG), Pentagon; Chief, General Litigation Branch, United States Army Legal Services Agency (USALSA), Fort Belvoir, Virginia; and Chief, Judge Advocate Recruiting Office, USALSA, Fort Belvoir, Virginia. BG Ranieri's other assignments include Brigade Judge Advocate, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, Fort Stewart, Georgia and Operation IRAQI FREEDOM; Special Assistant United States Attorney, Civil Division, Department of Justice, Alexandria, Virginia and Washington, DC; Litigation Attorney, USALSA, Arlington, Virginia; Defense Counsel, United States Army Trial Defense Service, Fort Belvoir, Virginia and Operation IRAQI FREEDOM; and Trial Counsel, Administrative Law Attorney, and Legal Assistance Attorney, 1st Brigade, 25th Infantry Division, Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington.
