Major General Thomas J. Romig was born in 1948 at Manhattan, Kansas. He graduated from Manhattan High School in 1966 and attended Kansas State University where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in 1970. He was commissioned through the ROTC program and entered active duty in October 1971. After graduating from the Infantry Officer Basic and Airborne Courses, he served almost six years as a Military Intelligence Officer at Fort Bragg, NC, and Fort Huachuca, AZ. During that time, he served as a Counterintelligence Officer, Tactical Intelligence Officer, Assistant Brigade S-2, and Infantry Battalion S-2.

In 1977, General Romig was selected for the Funded Legal Education Program and attended the University of Santa Clara School of Law, Santa Clara, California, where he served as an editor on the Santa Clara Law Review and as a member of the Honors Moot Court Board. He graduated with honors in 1980.

General Romig's most recent assignment was as the Assistant Judge Advocate General for Military Law and Operations, Office of The Judge Advocate General, United States Army, Rosslyn, Virginia. His other assignments as a Judge Advocate include: Assistant Judge Advocate General for Civil Law and Litigation, Office of The Judge Advocate General, Arlington, Virginia, 1998-1999; Staff Judge Advocate, V Corps serving in Heidelberg, Germany, and in Taszar, Hungary, in support of Operation Joint Endeavor/Guard, 1996-1998; Chief Personnel/Assistant Chief, Personnel, Plans, and Training Office, Office of The Judge Advocate General, 1993-1995; Staff Judge Advocate, 32d Army Air Defense Command, Darmstadt, Germany, 1990-1993; Plans Officer, Personnel, Plans, and Training Office, Office of The Judge Advocate General, 1988-1990; Instructor, International and Operational Law, The Judge Advocate General's School, Charlottesville, VA; 1984-1987; and Trial Counsel, Senior Trial Counsel, Chief of Legal Assistance, and Chief of Criminal Law, 2d Armored Division, Fort Hood, Texas, 1980-1983.

General Romig's decorations and badges include the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal with four Oak Leaf Clusters, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal with one bronze service star, Armed Forces Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Army Overseas Service Ribbon second award, NATO Medal, Parachutist Badge, and Army Staff Identification Badge. General Romig is a graduate of the National War College and the Armed Forces Staff College.
