



**BRIGADIER GENERAL MARILYN S. CHIAFULLO
UNITED STATES ARMY RESERVE
JUDGE ADVOCATE GENERAL'S CORPS**



Brigadier General Marilyn S. Chiafullo is currently assigned as the Chief Judge (Individual Mobilization Augmentee), U.S. Army Court of Criminal Appeals. Prior to this assignment, Brigadier General Chiafullo served as Assistant Judge Advocate General, for Military Law & Operations (Individual Mobilized Augmentee), Office of The Judge Advocate General (OTJAG). BG Chiafullo's previous assignments include: Chief of Staff, United States Army Reserve Legal Command; Chief, Reserve Component Management, OTJAG, Personnel, Plans and Training Office (PP&TO); Staff Judge Advocate, Division West, First Army, Fort Hood, Texas.

In July 2009, she completed a Senior Service College Fellowship in International Security Studies at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, Tufts University, Boston, Massachusetts. Brigadier General Chiafullo has been a member of the Army Judge Advocate General's Corps since 1993. She was commissioned in the Quartermaster Corps following Officer Candidate School in 1990. Other prior assignments include Career Management and Plans Officer, OTJAG, PP&TO; Senior Defense Counsel, 154th Legal Support Organization; Chief, Administrative and Civil Law Division, 99th Regional Support Command (RSC); Assistant Chief, Criminal Law, 99th RSC; Trial Defense Counsel (TDS), 82d Airborne Division; Chief, Legal Assistance/Claims and Federal Magistrate's Court Prosecutor, Fort Ritchie, Maryland; Platoon Leader and Executive Officer, 475th Quartermaster Company, Beaver Falls, PA.

Brigadier General Chiafullo was mobilized in support of Operation Noble Eagle as a Senior Defense Counsel to serve with the 82d Airborne Division. During this mobilization, Brigadier General Chiafullo deployed as Senior Defense Counsel in support of Operation Enduring Freedom to Karshi-Kanabad, Uzbekistan and Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan. Brigadier General Chiafullo received her Juris Doctorate in 1993 from Duquesne University School of Law. She received her Bachelors of Science in Education from Slippery Rock University in 1983 and spent three years as a junior high school teacher and coach. Brigadier General Chiafullo is admitted to practice before the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, U.S. District Court, Western District of Pennsylvania.
